

ENDURING POWER OF ATTORNEY

An enduring power of attorney continues in the event that you can't manage your affairs and covers both financial and personal or health decisions. If you have an accident or illness and can't make decisions for yourself, the enduring power of attorney gives decision making power to the person you've nominated. The kinds of decisions your attorney can make include:-

- financial: paying bills, dealing with Centrelink, taxation, legal & property matters
- personal/health attorney: your living arrangements, your health care, your diet and dress
